### JAMAICA ADDS ONE MORE MEDAL TO TALLY

On the penultimate day of competition at the Central America and Caribbean Swimming Championships, the Jamaican swimmers only manage to add one (1) more medal to their tally.

Natasha Moodie put on a fairly good show to capture silver in the 15-17 Girls 100M Breaststroke in a time of 1:18.92. Kendese Nangle found the pack a little tough and maintained her 5<sup>th</sup> place finish in the finals with a time of 1:26.46 in the 11-12 Girls 100M Breaststroke. Dominic Walter swam a personal best of 4:21.03 in the 13-14 Boys 400M Freestyle to place 6<sup>th</sup> while Xavier Boland finished 7<sup>th</sup> in the 11-12 Boys 100M Breaststroke in a time of 1:18.85.

On today's final day of competition, all eight (8) swimmers will be trying to end the championship on a high and will compete in the following events this morning:
