### **MORE MEDALS PROSPECTS ON DAY 3 OF SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Jamaica is poised to increase its medal tally on Day 3 of the Central America and Caribbean Swimming Championships (CCCAN) as several of the swimmers advance to tonight's finals.

In the Preliminary rounds this morning, Natasha Moodie qualified with the fastest time in the 15-17 Girls 100M Freestyle in a time of 59.92 secs. She later went on to place 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 15-17 Girls 50M Breaststroke in a time of 35.15 secs. Kendese Nangle placed 5<sup>th</sup> in both her preliminary events, with a time of 1.05.48 in the 11-12 Girls 100M Freestyle and 39.36 secs in the 11-12 Girls 50M Breaststroke.
